#### MINISTER'S LETTER



I have just come in from Highlands Toddler group where we have been exploring the topic of feelings. There is nothing so intimidating as a group of 2 year olds showing you on mass their "cross face." They don't hold anything back and are totally committed to the course of action. Equally, there is nothing more uplifting than a sea of their smiling faces beaming in one accord at you, while they sing, "If you're happy and you know it, stamp your feet!"

My grandma used to say to me that by the time you are 40, you have the face that you deserve! I was always a bit mystified by this as a child, but I think she meant that if experience had made you doubt other people's motives, or made you cynical about life, it usually shows in your face. If you have found yourself defensive all the time, stress will be written in the tightness of your mouth and hardness of your eyes. If you have been caught in worry, anxiety will be displayed in a hesitant gaze and still face.

If you have been able to smile in spite of everything; if you have learned to tolerate people, and recognise your own failings in others, it will be seen clearly in your face. So maybe there was something in what she said; that our faces reflect our experience. What the saying implies, however, is that when you are 40, you are stuck with the face that you have.

I am not sure that this is true. I have seen people coming together after years of being at odds with each other and seen how forgiveness transformed their faces, with the bitterness being washed away.

I have seen a marriage; late in life and unexpected transform a closed face into one of gentle smiling relaxedness. Whether you are 40, 50, 60, 70, 80, or 90, it doesn't matter. Love or courage, or resilience in suffering, can and does change us at any age.

Prayer also changes us, changes how we think and act. In prayer we draw near to the source of love and courage and call on God to fill us with his Spirit, so that whatever our problems may be, they do not overcome us. Rather we are able to face them, not in weakness, but in the strength of his love and the knowledge that the love of God ultimately overcomes all evil and suffering and even death itself.

So let us pray with confidence this autumn as we say:

Holy Spirit, come down and enter into our being;

To those who are anxious or perplexed, give peace;

To those who are weary, give rest;

comfort those who mourn;

and according to your wisdom and will for us,

heal the sick, strengthen those in need,

so that your love will live in our hearts,

and be reflected in our lives and in our faces! Amen

#### AND ARE WE YET ALIVE, AND SEE EACH OTHER'S FACE?

The above is the first line of a hymn, which I have sung many times before, but on Saturday July 2 at the Methodist Central Hall, Westminster I joined with a huge crowd (ticket only) and sang it at the OPENING SERVICE of the METHODIST CONFERENCE. This takes place annually in different parts of the country and this year was in London. I only found out recently that anyone may go to conference as an observer. I went twice.

The opening service was inspirational. The President for 2016/7, Rev. Roger Walton and the Vice President, Rachel Lampard were inducted and both addressed conference. I first met Roger, when he led our daily bible studies at Methodist Summer Fellowship 2011.

His presidential address was about HOLINESS and he used other terms to explain including SPIRITUAL FITNESS, WHOLENESS AND RESILIENCE.

I went back on the Monday and observed CONFERENCE in action. Rachel Lampard chaired a session on the International Day for remembrance of the slave trade and its abolition. Other speakers spoke of modern day slavery and the need for action. On both days I looked around the Exhibition and engaged with the exhibitors. I had planned out what I wanted to see and do, but I did not complete my list, but did learn a lot. Each day my rucksack got heavier and heavier.

I spent time with the Action for Children team and explained our circumstances at Wesley. I did agree to be our church contact.

I bumped into Jane Leach, Principal of Wesley House, Cambridge and talked to her about the 2017/8 Worship Academy programme and she is happy to receive an invitation. If you want some good reading ask me to forward to you their on line magazine; HOLINESS.

I had never heard of OUTCOME, but chatted away to both exhibitors and later walked around London wearing a badge which read: Some people are gay, get over it. This made for an interesting conversation on West Ham station later. The Methodist Heritage staff were wonderful. My Mum grew up as a Primitive Methodist and always thought of herself as a Prim., even after she had joined a Wesley Methodist Church. We want to spend one holiday visiting some of the

Methodist Heritage sites including Epworth and the Englesea Brook museum of Primitive Methodism. We may get to the New Room in Bristol this Summer.

Over two short days I merely experienced a snapshot, but all was time well spent and I was very interested in what I saw. When CONFERENCE returns to London I shall definitely want to go again. You might want to consider it. Do ask me about it if interested.

#### **FUND RAISING AND DONATIONS**

You have raised / donated: -

The end of year accounts are done and, despite my pleas for more money (or less spending), you should all give yourselves a big pat on the back for the amount of fund raising and donations that have been made during this past year.

£6689 to various charities £28,069 towards the building fund £6000 towards other property projects within Wesley £1150 for general church funds Plus, the daily coffee mornings have raised a total of £3,985.66 for church funds. That's a total of £41.908!

You may have seen in the weekly notices that we have reached the £500,000 mark for the building fund and this includes Grants received in addition to 2 years' worth of local fund raising totally £58,550.

**Please don't stop!** Not only do we still have £50,000 to raise for the building fund, Wesley is in need of some cosmetic TLC (decorating), we need to increase our reserves for the unforeseen problems and it would still be nice to support as many external charities that we can.

Some may not have money to give but are able to offer their skills in other areas i.e. stewarding, organising fund raising activities, making coffee and tea, cleaning and tidying up, making sure the church runs smoothly, supporting the youth and older peoples work in the church, lending an ear or a shoulder to cry on. #### Monthly Movies

Interest for these monthly events is growing in momentum. We regularly have between 15 and 30 people at both Highlands and Wesley. Highlands have taken the proactive initiative to offer soup which has been very well received.

#### Holidaying at Home

Two very successful events took place at Highlands on 27<sup>th</sup> July and Wesley on 4<sup>th</sup> August, bringing a total of 65 people into both churches for a lively nostalgic seaside day. You are welcome to read the compiled feedback report which is available in the concourse at Wesley and at the back of the church at Highlands.

#### Age Concern Community Club

Age Concern are very happy with their new home at Wesley. They book the Wesley concourse for two hours on a Tuesday afternoon; three out of four weeks a month. We work together to find guest speakers and encourage members to join other activities. They are a small independent local charity that struggles to maintain funding, so welcome church collaboration.

#### Staying Steady Exercise Classes for Older People

This group has become a valued weekly group that meet on a Tuesday morning in Wesley canteen room. I am hoping we can establish a follow on class to Staying Steady at Wesley for the current Staying Steady group to progress on to.

I have also had it agreed to start a Staying Steady class at Highlands but we are currently waiting for a class instructor to become available. There are a number of Highlands members that I hope will really benefit from having this facility so close to home.

#### **Objectives Q4**

Becoming a Dementia Friendly Church

On the 11<sup>th</sup> June I attended a study day entitled "The Spiritual Needs of the Elderly and those with Dementia"; where I learned the following shocking statistic "1 in 3 people over 65 will go on to develop a form of Dementia" For some elderly people, the church is the only point of contact with the world. As a church we have a tangible ability to reduce isolation and improve people's health and selfworth. The need for positive affirmation is as important in older life as it is to a child. "I believe; help my unbelief" (Mark 9:24)

Julia and I have a meeting shortly with Nancy Smith, Strategy & Commissioning Officer for Dementia at Southend Borough Council in order to establish how Highlands and Wesley can become Dementia friendly churches? The hope is that we can offer Dementia friend training to all church members who would like to support this initiative. Please do come and have a chat if you would like to be involved in supporting this initiative.

Wesley Age Concern Community Club Christmas Lunch & Carol Service - 21<sup>st</sup> December

Age Concern are inviting local older people to a Christmas lunch and Carol service at Wesley. - 1 Sat Father, Creator, we thank you for the infinite variety of all living creatures and beings with whom we share the world. We are stewards of the earth and guardians of your creation. We pray that we do not destroy it or lose any part of it though our ignorance or greed.
- 2 Sun *Angela Ashwin* Loving God, we pray for the unity of all your people. Teach us to enjoy our diversity, healing those who have suffered verbal and physical abuse, and making whole those who have inflicted those injuries. Help us to move towards peaceful coexistence with our fellows.
- 3 Mon Loving and caring God, whose unfailing compassion is ever present. We ask to spiritually strengthen those who find themselves homeless, having left their countries in order to survive. We pray that they will find liberty, security and acceptance wherever they choose to settle.
- 4 Tue Heavenly Father, we ask you to bless and give thanks for all those who have responded to providing the necessities for the homeless in Southend. We pray that many marginalised people will find that they are loved and valued and that we care for them.
- 5 Wed Loving God, we remember the people in our society who do not live by our rules preferring to commit crimes against us, to live immorally and without regard for their actions. We pray for all your people who work tirelessly and voluntarily in visiting prisoners and those in deprived areas providing a listening ear, practical help and a link with Christians who know the presence of Jesus and can explain his love for us all and that his death and resurrection means we may seek forgiveness from God.
- 6 Thu From the Eastern Church Thank you merciful Father for loving and forgiving those who offend you and other people by their actions. We pray, by their grace they are saved even though they hate and mistreat others.

7 Fri A Muslim prayer from an Ancient Persian Prayer
All that we ought to have thought and have not thought,
All that we ought to have said and not said,
All that we ought to have done and have not done
All that we ought not to have thought and yet have thought
All that we ought not to have spoken and yet have spoken

19 Wed With humility, with awareness of the existence of life and of the sufferings that are going on around us, let us pray for the establishment of peace in our hearts and on earth. Amen

20 Thu *One world week – World Council of Churches* Eternal God, whose image lies in the heart of all people. We live among peoples whose ways are different from ours, whose faiths may be foreign to us, whose tongues are unintelligible to us. Help us to remember that you love all people with your great love. That all religion is an attempt to respond to you. And the yearnings of other hearts are much like our own and are known to you. We pray through Christ who is a stranger to no one land more than another, and to every land no less than to another.

- 21 Fri *Psalm 18:1* I will love thee, O Lord, my strength; the Lord is my rock, and my defence: my Saviour, my God, and my might, in whom I will trust.
