MINISTER'S LETTER



'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?'

Jesus answered, 'You must love the Lord your God, with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment. The second resembles it: You must love your neighbour as yourself. On these two commandments hang the whole Law, and the Prophets also.'

Matthew 22: 36 - 40

I have been meeting with a young person recently, to begin to talk about faith and the journey of navigating the bible. We came to the conclusion that if you wanted to sum up the bible in one paragraph, them the one above would do nicely. And if Jesus had wanted to tweet, the Old Testament Scriptures could be distilled down to 'You must love.'

If we look at Matthew 22 closely, we find that although it contains two commands to love, it holds 3 important instructions on love. We should love God, we should love others and equally we should love ourselves. This last one of loving ourselves can often get left out of the equation, but it is inextricably caught up in the other two. If we draw near to God, then we begin to expose ourselves to God's love and we learn to experience and understand that we are loved. It is like the baby receiving their parents loving smiles and gaze, gradually they begin to take in and understand a parent's love.

When, in our walk of faith, we come to experience God's unique love, then we can begin to accept and love ourselves. This is a huge step forward in loving, because then we not only reciprocate God's love, but turn towards others in love. It's an odd thing really, but every time we can accept ourselves, we are freed from preoccupation about ourselves to really turn and see others as they are. We can look at them for the first time to see their struggles and challenges as well as their joys and happiness. The more we can accept ourselves as we are, the more we can accept everyone else. It's all about learning to receive God's love and finding the worth in ourselves that will free us to love others. As Charles Wesley captures it, we are transformed into all that God would have us be, through being *"lost in wonder, love and praise"*- surely a tweet distilling the New Testament to its essence.

> Finish then thy new creation; pure and spotless let us be; let us see thy great salvation perfectly restored in thee: changed from glory into glory, till in heaven we take our place, till we cast our crowns before thee, lost in wonder, love, and praise.

BEHIND CLOSED DOORS - Part 1

After much discussion and heart searching within the church, as Sue Hockett put it in a recent service "the decorators arrived".

On 4th July the contractor started work on the project to conserve and update the church. First the pews were removed and thanks to the work of June and Alan quickly disappeared from the car park. Then they put up the hoarding and we are very grateful to Mary Lister who with help is turning it into a work of art.

Specialists came and carefully removed the memorial window to take it away to be incorporated in the new lobby screen. Then followed the dusty work of enlarging the memorial window opening to create the new entrance. Consistent with our wishes to respect the history of our church by keeping the entrance porch work will soon start on the creation of the new steps and ramp. A base has been cast to relocate the font under the gallery in the south east corner.

Already we are beginning to see emerging the beautiful simplicity that impressed many of us when we visited Avenue Road Baptist. The beauty of our stained glass windows is standing out and making an even greater contribution to the quality of the church. As you walk up the steps the enlarged opening allows you to see the strength of the roof in a way that has not been possible before.

As we go to print work is proceeding on the installation of the new heating and electrical services together with infilling the aisles to create a level floor and once complete work will move to installing the new lighting systems.

An order has been placed for the manufacture of the chairs by a specialist in Thirsk Yorkshire so that they are ready for the end of November. The colour chosen picks out an element of the stained glass

Alan and Mick the site manager are working well together to minimise disruption both to the church and the building contract-there will always be some.

There is still a long way to go but for now we can say that we are on programme to deliver a refreshed and enhanced church capable of seating the largest number of people in central Leigh.

The 2016 Week of Accompanied Prayer From Sunday 9th – Sunday 16th October, the Leigh Section will be joining with St Clements to hold a Week of Accompanied Prayer.

Why are we having a Week of Accompanied Prayer (WAP)?

The purpose of such weeks is to encourage people in their prayer lives by providing an opportunity to reflect each day on their prayer, in the company of a prayer guide, or companion. What an individual participant experiences, over the course of the week, will be unique to them. For example, one may learn different ways in which to pray, another be helped to overcome a difficulty they have with prayer and someone else may simply begin to pray regularly for the first time. Often people experience a new or deeper meaning in their prayer and a greater awareness of God's presence in their daily lives.

It sounds like a retreat. If I take part, do I have to go somewhere special for the whole week?

A WAP is like a retreat but it doesn't involve going away for the week. Each day you will meet with your guide for thirty minutes either at one of the section churches or at St Clements. You will be invited to set aside thirty minutes to pray on your own each day. For the rest of the time the activities of your day continue as they would normally whilst feeding into and being fed by prayer.

Who are the Prayer Guides?

The team of prayer guides may include women and men of various denominations, some lay, some ordained and possibly some members of religious orders. All will have received training in helping others in their prayer. The role of the guide is mainly to listen: to accompany the participants during the week, encouraging each person to honour his or her own prayer and to be aware of how it may be developed.

Does the WAP cost anything?

Although the WAP is free to join, the week will cost in the region of ± 500 to put on and therefore we suggest that you consider making a donation of ± 5 to ± 10 to contribute to these costs.

Where can I get more information?

Between June and the beginning of October more information is available at both St Clements's and Wesley Methodist churches.

If you are uncertain whether the WAP is for you, please feel free to talk with Rev Julia.

Some feedback from participants in the WAP last year:

Before the WAP I was nervous and not sure if I was doing the right thing for me. I am grateful to the WAP for making me aware of the benefit of a dedicated time for prayer. Before the WAP my feelings and expectations were that something suitable for me and my needs was being offered. It helped me to become more aware of the presence of God within and around me.

I am grateful to the WAP because it has cleared my head of unnecessary "gabbling" at prayer and has shown me the value of silence and how God really speaks to me in the silence!



DO YOU KNOW?

Do you know that our annual circuit assessment for 2016/17 is £41,939? This equates to £36.00 per member, per month.

Do you know that our circuit assessment helps to pay for our Minister, their home, expenses, training, goes towards circuit grants (which Wesley have done very well out of for the youth worker post over the past 6 years) and many other expenditure items?

Do you know that our annual offertory income for 2015/16 was just over £24,000?

As you can see our offertory giving does not match our circuit assessment by nearly £18,000!

The circuit assessment is the first call on our resources, before salaries, repairs and maintenance and general expenses but, without money for these other expenses, the church wouldn't be able to function and fulfil its Mission of proclaiming the love of God, revealed in Jesus Christ, and helping people in their search for God. Our income from the many outside lets we have help with some of these costs, but not all. This is why we have to fund raise during the year and also ask for your help at our annual Gift Day.

With the building redevelopment going on, I appreciate that you are being asked to contribute financially and fund raise more than ever before but, Please, Please could you look at how much you are able to give each week / month and increase your giving if possible. Also, if you are a tax payer, please Gift Aid your offertory as we can then claim back a further 25% which costs you nothing.

If anyone would like to set up monthly giving by bank standing order, then the details you need are below. Think, no more trying to find change for the offertory bag on a Sunday or to put in your envelope – you will know exactly what is going out

and when it's going out and you can be like royalty, never having to carry money with you to church (unless there's a fund raising event of course!)

WESLEY BUILDING FUND TEAM NEWS - An update on recent events


