MINISTER'S LETTER

The Coming of the Spirit



The feast of Pentecost comes 50 days after the Passover and, due to the favorable June weather, Jerusalem was filled with pilgrims. The disciples were there; huddled together in one room, back to the number 12, having replaced Judas with Matthias.

They were doing what Jesus has asked them to do, waiting in Jerusalem for the power of the Holy Spirit (Acts 1: 4-8).

We will never know quite what happened to the disciples at Pentecost, but we know that one moment they were hesitant, frightened and unable to speak out; and the next they were ready to go, bold and courageous and wonderfully coherent - ready to be witnesses to the life of Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit and his power.

In the first 13 chapters of Acts there are over 40 references to the Holy Spirit, enabling, ministering, moving and guiding people. The Acts of the Apostles has been called the Gospel of the Holy Spirit, and if we look to links back to the Old Testament, its coming is a fulfillment of the longing expressed by Moses, that God would pour out his Spirit on all people, not just a chosen few who required a special anointing.

Wind is understood as the hidden presence of God, not seen but felt. New life *breathed* into the disciples. Fire is the symbol for the presence of God. Again we think of Moses and the burning bush. It is the sign of a strong power at work, bringing direction, guidance, and enlightenment. At Pentecost the disciples were given new vision and vigor. That same Spirit is offered to us and we celebrate that Jesus keeps his promises. He has not left us bereft and His Spirit is at work within each one of us.

Next week it's my birthday and the family will be coming home. Andrew will arrive with all his stuff, and once he's dumped it in his room and before he comes and sits and shares all the latest news, he will go and play the piano, a sort of medley of old classical favorites, new stuff and pieces he's working on now. When he's away, the piano is forlorn, except for my one handed versions of tunes from Singing the Faith, as I pick hymns for a Sunday. As I trip over the sharps and flats, it's all a bit cranky and lifeless but on Thursday night, in the right hands, the piano will come to life and sing. May the coming of the Spirit, breathe new life into each one of us that we might sing as we were made too, in harmony, melody and rhythm. In the name of Jesus. Amen.

WESLEY METHODIST CHURCH JOINS THE LEIGH ART TRAIL

Opening times: Sat 10 June, 10 am to 4 pm. Sunday 11 June, 1 pm to 4 pm. Mon 12 June to Sat 17 June, 10 am to 4 pm.

ARTIST David Crawford is displaying his work at Wesley Methodist Church as part of LEIGH ART TRAIL. David said art makes life memorable for him, and being creative is both a need and a passion. He went to school in Wickford and started his art training at Southend Technical College and has been teaching art to adults for ten years, now in Southend and Rochford Community Colleges.

Why is the Church always asking for money?

The answer is very simple. Because it seldom has enough; enough to do all it needs to do and wants to do.

The costs of running our church increases each year. This is something we can easily understand because the cost of running our own homes increases each year as well. There are buildings to maintain, lighting and heating to pay for and a host of other expenses just to support the work of the ministry – including staff costs. This all represents the 'housekeeping' of our church family. But our support of the church should include more than just its housekeeping (or Maintenance). There is also the Mission work of the church to think about. The Church isn't just bricks and mortar.

The Church is people!

- St. Paul tells us the Church is the body of Christ.
- St. Theresa of Avila helps us to understand what that means in her prayer:

"Christ has no body on earth but ours. No hands but ours. No feet but ours. Ours are the eyes through which is to look out Christ's compassion to the world. Ours are the feet with which He is to go about doing good. Ours are the hands with which He is to bless men now".

To that prayer we probably ought to add:

He has no purse but ours. Ours is the money that enables good works to happen.

So we also give to the Church in order to further its mission and the ministry of Christ in the community and in the world.

What does it cost?

Currently our Income does not meet our Expenditure. Our shortfall this year is likely to be £11,000 which equates to about £200 per week. So, we need £200 per week more just to break even. But, we need to do more than that. We need to put ourselves on a firm financial basis for the future. We have a history of very generous giving at Wesley – as evidenced by the way that the funding for Building Redevelopment has so swiftly been covered. Wesley has a lively past – it should now have an exciting future in Mission.

Thinking about our future giving

So what can we do about this? Below are some questions we might want to ask ourselves:

- How much do we give now?
- What is that as a percentage of income?
- Can we increase our giving? By 1p or 2p in the £ or more?
- Could we sponsor part of the cost of a staff member, supporting our work in the community?

Can we join a planned giving scheme – either a Standing Order or join the
Envelope scheme. The giving of those not in a Planned Giving scheme is likely to
be less – for a start there is no tax refund and generally people only give when
they come to church. Yet the costs of running our church are the same whether
we are there or not.

To summarise....

- We have a Challenge our expenditure exceeds our income by £200 per week.
- Wesley has a fine past. It should also have an exciting future.
- As members of the family of Wesley, we have to decide whether we are going to limp along from year to year or whether we are going to set our church on a firm basis for the future.
- The matter is in our hands. Let us consider carefully and prayerfully the response we should make.
- We must think not only about our financial giving, but what else we can give in terms of our time and skills.

Thought for the day

Isn't it strange how **BIG** a £20 seems when we are about to put it in the offering but how **SMALL** it becomes when we take it to the supermarket?

TIME FOR HEALING

The next Time for Healing Prayer Group will be held on June 17th 11.30am-12.30pm. The format usually includes prayers of thanksgiving and intercession, together with a short meditation on the theme of healing followed by the opportunity for private prayer. It is open to anyone, so please come and join us if you can. (Dates for July and August are yet to be arranged and will be advised shortly.)

The meditation used at the May meeting was as follows:

Faith in the Good Shepherd and the Lamb

Matthew 8:5-9 &13

When Jesus had entered Capernaum, a centurion came to him asking for his help. "Lord," he said, "my servant lies at home paralysed and in terrible suffering."

Jesus said to him, "I will go and heal him."

The centurion replied, "Lord, I do not deserve to have you come under my roof. But just say the word and my servant will be healed. For I myself am a man under authority, with soldiers under me. I tell this one, 'Go,' and he goes; and that one 'Come,' and he comes. I say to my servant 'Do this,' and he does it." ...

...Then Jesus said to the centurion, "Go! It will be done just as you believed it would." And his servant was healed at that very hour.

(Taken from The Holy Bible – New International Version)

The above verses are taken from the story of the centurion who asked Jesus to heal his servant and who was so confident in His healing power that he did not feel that Jesus needed to attend his house personally to effect the healing he sought for his servant. Jesus is said to be "astonished" at the centurion's faith and heals the servant as requested. It is one of the few healing miracles mentioned in the Gospels where Jesus is not actually with the person who is being healed.

Other examples are: the healing of the daughter of the Canaanite woman who is persistent in seeking Christ's help (see Matthew 15:21-28.); or the royal official's son at Capernaum (see John 4:46-53).

Matthew 15:28

Then Jesus answered, "Woman, you have great faith! Your request is granted." And her daughter was healed from that very hour.

John 4:53

Then the father realised that this was the exact time at which Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." So he and all his household believed.

(Taken from The Holy Bible – New International Version)

Today we can take heart from these examples and His commission to heal the sick, and recognise that God's healing power is still available to those who seek it. When we pray with others, or for ourselves, we are in the same position as those who trusted Christ to effect a healing without Him having to be physically present. Healing comes in many ways and will include all our modern medicines and treatments. Our prayers may be about gaining the right treatment or therapies, or possibly assisting us to accept any adjustments or changes that may be necessary to make these more effective or less distressing. Our prayers may also be part of coming to terms with an outcome that is not what we desired. However we know we can trust God to do what is ultimately right for us. Christ's sacrifice for us on the cross is the proof of God's love for us all, as the Good Shepherd laid down his life for the sheep by becoming the sacrificial Lamb. He is always with us.

For whoever believes in the power of the blood of Jesus, nothing is impossible!

The Lord shall surely perfect that thing, that thing which concerneth thee.


