


MINISTER'S LETTER

RETUNING



Dear Readers, I write this on the hottest day of the year, reflecting that this is weather for the beach and not for dog collars and work. Still, not long now until a week away in France and an opportunity to recharge the batteries after a full and eventful year. Though in terms of spiritual refreshment, I don't know whether *recharging the batteries* is the right image to be thinking on. Batteries are items that we need to supply ourselves with in order to make things work - as we often discover to our irritation, when we unpack whatever we have bought and find we should have read the small print that tells us, "Batteries not included".

Rechargeable batteries don't work forever either. Sooner or later they lose their capacity for supplying energy. Our Christian faith on the other hand, however we have embraced it, whether through baptism or some other form of commitment, connects us straight to the mains, the source of Life! The love of God, shown to us supremely through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus, embraces us in the life-giving power of the Holy Spirit, as she fills our lives with assurance and confidence in Christ.

The challenge is that our reception gets distorted through the static of life, stuff, our preoccupations, and the interference of our busyness! So from time to time, we need to retune and clean and sharpen up our contact points.

That I think is a more helpful picture, because it reminds us that the initiative always lies with God. All we are called to do is respond. Our responsibility lies in making ourselves as open and receptive as we can be to God's gift of life. Spiritual writer, Ann Lewin, says that hymns like '*Father hear the prayer we offer,*' put in front of us a spirituality which leaves us no time for resting in God to sharpen up our contact points. She has therefore rewritten the hymn, and I offer it here to you for reflection.

The Prayer We Offer

Not for ease? Why not?

What's wrong with ease?

For most of us the

Problem is not self-indulgence,

But that we allow ourselves too little.

Prohibitions, counsels of perfection,

Drive us and load us up with guilt.

Time enough for courageous living

Seasons of the Spirit: for Lammas and Harvest-tide

As the next holy season of Lammas-tide is now coming into view, I take the liberty of forwarding a Lammas-tide hymn which I wrote in 2003 (see page 23) . Lammas (1st August) traditionally celebrates the first sheaves of the harvest, and from them the first grain, which is ground and baked into the communion loaf for the Lammas-tide service. Traditionally this was the 'loaf mass', which celebrated the commencement of the harvest season. I had tried to find a hymn which celebrated this for a Lammas-tide service of my own, but failed – so I had no option other than to write my own!

I very much hope that someone comes forward to take on the Traidcraft stall. I was very impressed to see that Wesley runs one.

TIME FOR HEALING

The next Time for Healing Prayer Group will be held on Sat July 22nd between 11.30am - 12.30pm. Meetings are typically attended by six to ten people with the majority often being from outside our usual church membership. The format usually includes prayers of thanksgiving and intercession, together with a short meditation on the theme of healing and occasional personal testimony. This is followed by the opportunity for private prayer with one or more of the group leaders. There will be no meeting in August and the next meeting will be on Saturday 9th September. It is open to anyone, so please come and join us if you can, and give, receive, or just take much needed time out.

The meditation used at the June meeting was as follows:

The continuing healing power of God

Acts 3: 1-10

One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer – at three in the afternoon. Now a man crippled from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts. When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. Peter looked straight at him as did John. Then Peter said, “Look at us!” So the man gave them his attention, expecting to get something from them.

Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God. When all the people saw him walking and praising God, they recognised him as the same man who used to sit at the temple gate called Beautiful, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

The above verses continue a theme of last month's meditation where Jesus is not actually physically present at the time and place of a person's healing. Indeed, this healing miracle takes place after Christ's resurrection and His ascension into heaven. In the subsequent verses of Acts 3, Peter and John go on to explain that the man's healing has taken place by the power of the Holy Spirit as they call on the power of Jesus' name.

Acts 3:16

By faith in the name of Jesus, this man whom you see and know was made strong. It is Jesus' name and the faith that comes through him that has given this complete healing to him, as you can all see.

So we should recognise and remember that the healing we seek is the product of asking in the name of Jesus for God's healing power to work in our situation. Sometimes the healing will be miraculous, or maybe it will be the positive outcome of some medical intervention. Our worldly resources are also gifts from God and His power always underpins the changes that are taking place.

However, we also know that healing does not always come about as we might expect and we may be at a loss to understand why this is. It is sometimes attributed to a lack of faith on behalf of the person seeking healing or the person praying for someone else's healing or that the illness is some sort of punishment from God. It is important to realise that this is not the case as the Holy Spirit is always praying for us.

Jesus was very clear on this as we see in the verses below:

John 9: 1-3

As he went along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the work of God might be displayed in his life."

We have to realise that healing is out of our control and that God's plan for each person may be different from what we might want or expect. Healing may involve accepting changes or outcomes that are not what we desired. Perhaps we need to ask what our life path is really about? Where is our journey taking us? What healing do we really need?

Isaiah 55: 8-9

"For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways," declares the Lord.

"As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts. .."

So, let us conclude with this prayer:

Lord we ask, in Jesus' name for the healing power of your Holy Spirit to come upon those we have named, or thought of, today and for their health to be restored according to your will and in your way and time. Amen.
