# Wesley Stories- Ken Cheeseman

Although I now live some 90 miles away in a little village, called Piddinghoe, of about 250 people I still consider Wesley in Leigh on Sea my spiritual home.

I was born in the terrace off Church Hill in 1930. I remember as a child going to Sunday School in Leigh Road Baptist Church. When war broke out in 1939 and the area of Leigh and the neighbourhood, and there the big

evacuation, particularly of children, my mother decided that I should stay with her in Leigh-on-Sea. So here I was a young lad of nine of ten years old let loose in the area now occupied by the military and the occasional dog lying in the middle of the London Road, undisturbed by traffic.

For about a year or more, I together with three other lads roamed the streets, possibly getting into mischief! My Mother said that I must look for something worthwhile to do. Slowly people drifted back in 1941 or thereabouts. Tom Parrinder decided to restart the Scout Troop. I, together with Steve Bates turned up to that first meeting. We were instantly made Patrol Leaders of Scouts not yet joined. Numbers soon swelled, and we had the makings of a scout troop at Wesley, closely linked to the church.

Through being a Kind's Scout in 2<sup>nd</sup> Leigh Wesley Troop, I was chosen with Tom Parrinder to be an usher at St. Paul's Cathedral at the wedding of Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip. I was lucky, and my job was to usher dignitaries to their seats near the altar. During the ceremony I stood behind a column nearby. Therefore, we can claim that a representative of Wesley was at the Royal Wedding!

The Youth Club started under the leadership of Ephraim Barney Levy, known as EBL. Name I can recall are: Ann Verinder, tea lady and Sunday School Leader of the Primary Dept, Cyril Hibble, Leader of the Fellowship, Mrs

Fraser arriving on her bicycle, Elsie Clackett teaching leather work (I still have the wallet made under her guidance), Phil Reader who started Wesley Drama Society with the Student Players for younger members, Rev.d Greville P Lewis (known as GP) who, with his family, lived in the Manse next to the Church. GP was a heavy smoker and one rarely saw him without a cigarette. David Buckey and I used to persuade Mrs Lewis to let us have the key of the hall so that we could play table tennis. Members of the Youth club were strongly urged to attend Church on Sunday evenings, the "Youth Gallery" almost full of rather noisy young people, on one occasion they had to be quietened by GP in the middle of his 45-minute sermon.

In 1945 at the tender age of 15 I was approached by EBL as to whether I would accept a note to preach, I said, "yes". Under the leadership of Ann Vender, I became a Primary dept Leader. It was here that I met Beryl Love, another teacher. Our friendship deepened and in 1951 we got married at Wesley, living in Undercliff Gardens, Chalkwell, we continued our involvement with Wesley.

In 1952, when beryl's father died, we moved to Park Road and we took up membership at Highlands Church, where we got deeply involved with the young people. In 1959 now being a qualified architect, I was asked by the trustees of Wesley to act for them in extensions of the premises with, enlarged Wesley Hall, a new youth hall and general refurbishing of other parts of the building.

One day in the late 60's I received a letter inviting me to become a Justice of the Peace, I shall never know but I think that it was Edith Bell who put my name and that of Nicholas Low forward, whilst we were in church. We joined the many officials who worshipped at Wesley – Mayors, Borough treasurer, Councillors etc.

In 1984 we moved to Piddinghoe but still maintained contact with Wesley through Margaret Buckey who suggested that I should write this article for the clarion. As I now have Parkinson's disease which limits my movement and nibbles away at my 'little grey cells', I find it very difficult to come to visit Wesley. It is still my spiritual home and I welcome news of life and events there.

How did I join the Wesley Family?

My life has been through several stages; My parents were Anglicans – I was baptised at St Michaels in Westcliff, I

was put on the Cradle Roll of Highlands Methodist Church by my Godmother, then I was taken to the High Church of St. Margaret's by my piano teacher.

Then came the war and children were evacuated from Leigh-on-Sea. I was not and was introduced to Wesley by going to the Small School Phyll Reader and her friends organised.

My family moved to Warwickshire – my mother was ill and I lived at sometime with my Aunt who took me to the Seventh Day Adventist Church.

Later when war was coming to an end we cam home and one week my father decided he would go to Leigh Wesley as they had been so welcoming to the troops who had been stationed in the town. The Revd.Greville Lewis was preaching and I started going weekly with my father who was a great admirer of him.

My friend Mary Blanch from Westcliff High School for Girls persuaded me to go with her to Church regularly and the two of us were invited to join the choir under Will Clackett. When Mary thought the sermon was too long she always had a need for smelling salts! With Mary I was asked to become a Sunday School teacher with Ann Verinder – and then I met my fate!!

One Sunday, after service Mary asked if I had dates during

the week, I said, No- so Mary dared a young Sunday School teacher and 'on note' Local Preacher, Ken Cheeseman to take me out – He accepted the dare and we went to the Palace Theatre Westcliff to see, 'The Ghost Train' and then walked all the way to my home in The Highlands in Leigh.

We were married in 1951 at Wesley Church with Mary as one of my Bridesmaids. She remained one of my dearest friends – now as Mary Bentley – until her early death. After several addresses in the Leigh-on-Sea are we started going to Highlands Methodist Church. Our four children were baptised there, followed by Sunday School membership. Ken was involved in youth work at Highlands and our home was open to all who needed it.

The family got older – I did more voluntary work: I became District Organiser of WRVS in Southend, District Chairman of Inner Wheel of District 24 (Formed from Southend to- in those day – Norwich- the borders of Hertfordshire and part of London east) and I must admit was one of those women who can't say 'no'! I have discovered the more you do the better your life. I have been very lucky all my life, but now I find I am 'falling to bits' and can do fewer jobs.

The spirit of Wesley Church is still my anchor and, if only as spectators, Ken and I are involved in as much as we can be and still value the ongoing help of family and friends.

- 2017/8 £5,135 rounded up or down to the nearest £ in the conventional way.
- In recent years we have organised Christmas Charities by choosing a charity to support for a specific service, but this year

- Church Council decided to support ONE CHARITY and next year another charity will be chosen.
- The congregation were consulted and ACTION FOR CHILDREN was suggested. Church Council decided to support. So, at our CAROL SERVICE ON DECEMBER 16 and at CHRISTMAS EVE COMMUNION the collections will go to AfC. If you are not able to be at either service, then there will still be a chance for you to give.
- Traditionally the ZONE chooses the Charity for CHRISTINGLE and this will happen and be published.
- An earlier Church Council decision was to confirm the choice I made in my bid for the ALLEGRO CHOIR concert. ALLEGRO only exist to enjoy their singing and to raise money for charity. It will be their third concert here at Wesley, at their request, as we are so hospitable. The concert is on Saturday JUNE 22 and funds raised will go to ALZHEIMERS and WESLEY'S WORK AMONG YOUNG PEOPLE, which we will give to FUSION. Allegro do all their own publicity and we help sell tickets etc then they will send us two cheques. This year we raised money for Wesley's work among older

people. We do invite the congregation and all our many local contacts to put the date in your new diary and buy tickets for a great evening of music and so support these charities.


