# <u>AFTERNOON TEA AND</u> <u>CAKES</u>

Rewind to five years ago when Wesley was thinking of new ways forward as a church and of our new redevelopment plans. We had opportunities to write down our ideas and had discussion groups during our church services. *One lady wanted Wesley to start a social afternoon, somewhere she could bring a friend, so they could talk together.* Something reasonably priced. There was little for the 60+age group so the idea of an Older Age Worker was formed. Julie Peek became Mission Enabler for Older People at Wesley and Highlands and with Rev. Julia this has developed into Monthly Film Shows, Holidaying at Home, Age Concern and Staying Steady Classes coming to Wesley and Memory Worship being established.

Four years ago Summertime Afternoon Tea and cakes began once a month from April until October. We did not know how it would evolve but it has become a safe place to meet old friends and new, a gentle outreach where each afternoon is enjoyed and looked forward to. Folk who are no longer able to worship on Sundays come and feel welcomed, they enjoy meeting with friends and it renews their strong connections to Wesley.

After a couple of months someone said, "You are making far too many cakes, Janet". I said "Well, we do need a really good selection, so people can take a slice, or two home and you never know a coach party might turn up!" Shortly afterwards a coach party of Christians from South Korea arrived, looking for a church that was open on a Thursday afternoon. They shared refreshments and Eileen and Alison were able to let them sing their praises and prayers inside our church.

Another lady only came in whilst waiting to welcome her husband who was moving into Memory House. She needed a calm place to have a cuppa and sat near to Betty Bambury. It turned out they had worked in the same building 43 years ago at Midland Bank, later called Access, so they spent the afternoon reminiscing.

Families have been reunited and restored by coming together on these afternoons, sharing a cup of tea and talking on neutral ground. How wonderful that Wesley can provide a healing space.

Angie Dewbury, who has moved to Hadleigh, can return to Wesley and see 20-25+ people during one afternoon moving from table to table. She feels most welcome at Hadleigh Methodist Church, but Wesley is still home church.

Peggy Gaze often came and fondly remembered serving tea and meals to the troops in the Canteen Room. She instantly knew we had moved the position on the serving hatch in the kitchen and she came alive reliving her memories.

Helpers have come forward to bake delicious cakes, make and serve tea, wash up and clear away and listen and talk with everyone who comes. There are always plenty of cakes to take home and many people share these cakes with their next-door neighbours, carers, friends and family who visit.

These afternoons are surprising, each one so different. They bring people together, providing an unhurried time for good conversation and friendship. This all happened because one lady from our church asked for a special time to bring her friend to share a cup of tea at Wesley.

### **OUR WESLEY STORIES.**

The book has been so well received by us all. I wrote an article about it and sent it into the BUZZ magazine and also sent them a copy of the book. BUZZ is a monthly on-line magazine and often the editor takes your story and prints extracts. Nothing was in the September edition, but THE GOOD NEWS IS that there was an article about the ALLEGRO concert I organised to support the work at

Wesley for Older People. Well done the Concerts group for getting the publicity. My article follows.

Wesley Methodist Church, Leigh on Sea, celebrates 120 years of Service to the local community.

For 120 years Wesley Methodist Church has served the local community. The stories have recently been published in a lovely book called:

#### **OUR WESLEY STORIES.**

John Wesley himself planted Methodism in Leigh and we know this from his personal diaries. He made six recorded visits between 1748 and 1756. On December 10th, 1750 he wrote:

"Rode to Leigh and found a little company seeking God and endeavoured to encourage them in provoking one another to love and good works."

Working back from the present over the past 120 years, which we are celebrating, here are just a few examples of service given with love and joy now and in the past.

Every third Monday afternoon we hold Memory Worship for those with and without Dementia. It is a joyful service and people come from the wider locality. It is much loved and is growing in popularity.

Six days a week we serve morning teas and coffees and offer a listening ear. In term time we hold a Parent and Toddler group every Wednesday morning and this has been going a very long time.

In the summer months we hold monthly Summer afternoon teas for the Over Sixties, priced at only £1, as one of our guests said that was all she could afford, but wanted to pay.

Every month we hold Time for Healing, which is one of our Time for Prayer Saturday morning weekly sessions.

Some of us work at the Circuit Night shelter, very ably led by Andrew Hyde, a member at another circuit church, Highlands. Janet Watson, also of Highlands, is our team leader and we have a team of cooks from the two churches and we welcome guests, serve wonderful meals and eat with our guests, then later put out the beds for the night and some serve breakfast in the morning. WE HAVE SHOWERS! It is wonderful to see guests coming out with clean hair and feeling so good. Janet even dries hair, and this has reduced me to tears watching her tenderly blow drying a young girl's hair.

#### **OUR WESLEY STORIES**

has an abundance of examples going back over so many years. During World war two Rev. Greville Lewis started a canteen for servicemen billeted in the area. A vast quantity of meals was served to men of many nationalities including British and Polish soldiers in the canteen room, which was also set up with bunks.

In the 1980's and well into the 90's Ivy Harnden and her team served Christmas lunch after the Christmas morning service followed by a social afternoon and tea for 40 plus guests. A real Family gathering.
