Southend CAP Debt Advice Centre – Great News

The Southend CAP Debt Advice Centre (SCDAC) started in 2014 serving those in financial distress in the Southend area. We have been remarkably successful with helping people get out of debt and to budget for a more positive future for themselves. Unfortunately, we have only been able to cover the Southend area and there are many people within South East Essex who do not have access to Christians Against Poverty (CAP).

The Trustees have been looking for ways to expand, certainly into Rochford, Hawkwell and Hockley but also, possibly, Rayleigh. We applied to the Methodist Connexion for a grant with the support of Wesley, Southend and Leigh Circuit and the BEH District

This application has been successful and will ensure the future of SCDAC for the next three years, including expansion.

We will be moving forward steadily to provide debt counsellors and befrienders for the whole new area and thank everyone for their prayers and support for the very valuable work we do for the least fortunate in our part of South East Essex.

Of course, we cannot sit on our laurels and slap our backs, we have to get up and do something about it, so we would be very grateful if anyone wants to become a supporter in one of three ways:

- a) go on our prayer support list,
- b) become a befriender for those we aim to help or
- c) make a regular donation to our work.
