The decision made at Church Council, September 2018, to concentrate on one charity only for all Christmas collections except Christingle seems to have been welcomed.

Action for Children was the charity chosen and Tina has reported to the following amounts: Action for Children: grand total of £854.63. The three services (evening Carol Service, Christmas Eve communion and Christmas morning) raised £503,02 plus another £220 in cheques written directly to AFC.

Carol singing raised £131.61 (I am not sure, but I think each year the group choose AFC, and this is separate from collections).

The Christingle collection was given for Winston's Wish and totalled £390.19. This Charity was chosen by the young people.




