MINISTER'S LETTER



I meet people every week who don't feel that they have anything to offer to the church in way of gifts and talents; disheartened people who have very little hope and positivity about their role within God's church. I think its probably human nature to look at others and wish we had their gifts or talents. But God's has made us all as individuals, all different, all for a purpose and necessary for the smooth working of the church. We are all cogs in the workings of the church.

1 Corinthians 12:14-22 tells us; '14 Yes, the body has many different parts, not just one part. ¹⁵ If the foot says, "I am not a part of the body because I am not a hand," that does not make it any less a part of the body. ¹⁶ And if the ear says, "I am not part of the body because I am not an eye," would that make it any less a part of the body? ¹⁷ If the whole body

were an eye, how would you hear? Or if your whole body were an ear, how would you smell anything?

¹⁸ But our bodies have many parts, and God has put each part just where he wants it. ¹⁹ How strange a body would be if it had only one part! ²⁰ Yes, there are many parts, but only one body. ²¹ The eye can never say to the hand, "I don't need you." The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you." ²² In fact, some parts of the body that seem weakest and least important are actually the most necessary.' [NLT] So, if you're feeling that you don't have a role or don't seem to fit in anywhere in church, then think again. YOU are important to God and to the smooth working of His church. You are a cog! Vital and important.

Take strength and encouragement from the reading above from 1 Corinthians, and find where you fit in your church. Every blessings,
