

NEWS FROM THE PEWS

'Thanks to decisive action by Southend Borough Council and support from a Christian charity, more than 100 local homeless people and rough sleepers have been given a place of safety and regular food for the duration of the present Coronavirus crisis.

SBC, acting partly through associated charitable organisations LoveSouthend, Street Spirit and OneLove, is funding single-room bed and breakfast accommodation in Southend to provide necessary isolation to local citizens who would otherwise find this impossible.

Meanwhile the Westcliff branch of a Catholic church charity St Vincent de Paul (SVP www.svp.org.uk) is funding lunchtime and evening meals to be prepared and delivered by volunteers, including local Methodist church members.

The crisis first arose in March, when the annual Southend Churches Winter Night Shelter (WNS) project was 2 weeks from ending. The national 'lockdown' measures meant that many of the WNS volunteers, being themselves classified 'vulnerable' were unable to serve. At the same time church premises were closing down. Local SVP member Daniel Cauchi grasped the nettle and put together an unused building (let without charge as a 'pop-up' shelter) in Short

Street, Southend with a recruitment programme for volunteers.

The success of the Short St Shelter was short lived. There were more people needing accommodation than anticipated. As the shelter became overcrowded SBC accepted responsibility and found B&B accommodation for all. Short St now provides evening meals 4 days a week. One Love covers 3 other evenings in the week. HARP and The Storehouse (www.harpsouthend.org.uk and www.storehouse.org.uk) provide lunches.
