Obituary James (Jim) Gray Mavin 14th January 1934 – 15th August 2020

Due to the many different restrictions imposed on us all due to Covid-19, I would like to share with Church Members, and friends who were unable to attend Jim's funeral service, a summarized account of the Eulogy which his son Paul bequeathed.

Jim was born in a small mining village called Pegswood, Northumberland.

His father, brother, and grandfather, in keeping with the rest of the local male population, worked in the mining industry. Jim wasn't keen on working underground, but obtained a position working in the local National Coal Board Offices. It was here and the local technical college, Jim learned to type, and became skilled in mathematics, numeracy, and accountancy.

Jim joined the RAF in 1952, and trained as a rear gunner, whilst stationed at Bletchley and Norwich. However, Jim was very keen about athletics, particularly when it came to sprinting and track events, and he was soon a member of the local RAF sports team. Following demob, he started to run competitively on the professional circuit winning many races, including prize money.

In 1954 Jim was demobbed and returned to Temples Gardens Morpeth, Northumberland where he joined his

brother Tony. It was here that Jim developed his lifelong passion with gardening. He became an allotment holder and grew many prize-winning leeks and onions in the annual, strongly contested North East shows. Jim was also very well known locally for his generosity with regular giving of home-grown fruit and vegetables to the local community.

In 1956 Jim secured a job as a Wages Clerk in Northgate Hospital, Morpeth. It was here Jim met Shirley, a young student nurse working with people who had mental health and learning difficulties. Shirley qualified, and in 1957 Jim and Shirley married commencing life together in Pegswood and then Longhorsely Village accompanied by a menagerie of pets including his favourite boxer dog called Rocky.

In 1964 he became Manager of a Turf Accounts in Blyth, Northumberland. It was here his mathematical skills proved very useful, since he had the ability to work out the most complex odds in his head. In 1971 Jim decided he wanted to change his job and returned to work for the NHS, at the Newcastle General Head Office, in the Accounts Department where he remained for the rest of his career until retirement in 1999.

Jim joined the local Masonic Lodge on 4th April,1967 and remained a Mason for the rest of his life rising to Mark Master and Worshipful Master in 1979/80. When Jim and Shirley moved to Essex he transferred his membership to St. Margarets Lodge. At the funeral it was interesting to see Masons were there to greet the cortege and to carry the coffin. Jim and Shirley have a son Paul, and two lovely grandchildren Alfie and Evie. In 2007 they decided to leave their bungalow, and move to Essex, so that they could be closer to the family. It was not long after, they came to Wesley Church where they have made great friendships. Jim's accounting skills have been so valuable at Wesley. He became a member of the money counting team from arriving at the Church, up to a few months before he passed away. Auditing our Table Tennis accounts from 2009, and

always so pleased to do them, never missing a year.

Sadly, Jim was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, but he never let the illness get the better of him. Jim, I think I speak for all when I say,

"You will be missed".

DAVID JOHNSON

My husband and I joined this Church only five years ago at the time when the Church Council were still discussing changes to this Sanctuary. Isn't it beautiful? David was passionate about Equality and diversity issues and ensuring things were relevant to the Younger Generation. It was a controversial scheme as some people preferred to keep the raised pews, but until they were removed wheel chair users could not enter the church through the front entrance and move anywhere in here and the rest of our buildings. For this phase 3 work the Building Development Group was formed with David invited to take the lead following his heavy involvement with the two earlier phases for the redevelopment of the church buildings from 1990 to 2002. David had contacts on both Leigh Town Council and Southend Borough Council and liaised with both.

David was a visionary and worked so hard, with others, to bring about the changes. This new sanctuary was officially opened in January 2017 and as you can see the architecture of the roof, the stained-glass windows and the balcony balustrades are all enhanced by the light and airy feel and flexible space.

David had a great sense of achievement and when all of this was completed and shortly after he stepped down from the Property Committee and Church Council after nearly 30 years Christian Service in such an important role. However, he continued to advise on property matters.

David had come back to Leigh in the early 1990's after many years working abroad and took up a role on the Property Committee which lead on to an elected post at circuit and later District level.

The booklet called Our Wesley Stories, is a gift to all of us and typically David insisted upon sharing the cost of producing it.

Let me read you snippets from his own story:

In our conversations David always told me that 'Wesley is our family church'. When I arrived Wesley a new House Group, called Cameo was being formed and David and I both joined. We shall miss him at our discussions. We became friends and recently he joined the 'football group' that meets at our house to have a meal and watch the televised games, the meal, and Cup Semi- Final on April 6th. were not the same without him.
