MINISTER'S LETTER



Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *'lencten'*, which means "spring." The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin His ministry. Traditionally, Lent has been all about giving things up, and over the years people have given up all sorts of things like chocolate, sweets, deserts, and even more recently Facebook and other social media activities!

I think giving things up *can* be helpful if it focuses our thoughts and prayers on our preparation for the arrival of Easter.

But I don't believe that Lent should be a time for *just* giving things up, but also for taking things up!

Sometimes, I think when we *really* look at our lives and the time we spend with God, we can often come to the

conclusion that we've fasted all year since the last Lenten season, or even longer, fasting our prayer life, fasting our daily devotional time, fasting our giving?

So, my prayer for all of us, me included, is that this Lenten season we would take some things up, and really prepare ourselves for the death and resurrection of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

And as we grow in our knowledge and personal relationship with Him, Easter will be a far greater experience for us as we commune and bring ourselves into His presence in this time of preparation and confession.

1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 tells us; ¹⁶ Rejoice always, ¹⁷ pray continually, ¹⁸ give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus.' [NIVUK]

The host is not just responsible for letting people into the service but also running the power point for the preacher. The hosts are all new to this type of service and are learning new things all the time, we would ask for your patience and support.

Notes following Worship Consultation and Mission Meeting 1st February 2021

Meeting held on Zoom

Apologies from Pastor Steve Mayo, Judy Taylor and Emma Hearne

Following devotions, we started by looking back on Worship in 2020.

1. FEEDBACK ON 2020 WORSHIP

Following the first Lockdown we met at Wesley in a Covid – safe manner, this involved, spacing chairs, mask-wearing, and no singing. Overall, this was found to be quite a lonely, strange experience which rather underlined what we were missing, we were not supposed to mix, and chat and this aspect is welcomed at Zoom services. Not everyone was able to attend the worship as they were shielding but are able to attend Zoom.

Going forward perhaps we need to rethink the format of live worship and get away from the traditional format while restrictions are in place, to try to overcome these drawbacks.

Zoom has been popular, but it is difficult to encourage the community to join in even with the links on the website and the safeguarding GDPR measures that are in place.

U tube services are also popular, reaching many more people than Zoom or Live worship. Many appreciate the combination of Zoom and U Tube. U Tube can be watched with partners and families who do not usually attend worship.

2. SURVEY RESULTS

The Survey on Worship has been emailed out, been on the church website and on Social media. It has been in the Clarion twice. The survey is anonymous. The Church has tried to ensure that the views of the community be heard, and it not just be an echo chamber.

We agreed that producing an updated leaflet about our services and facilities with links to our online worship and the types of worship we offer. This could also include information about the survey. We could advertise our desire to get the community's views by putting a poster outside Wesley.

The intention is to leaflet drop in Leigh, post-Covid people may be more open to hearing the message.

Whilst we do not know the government restrictions which will be in place for Easter, we thought that the following would be good ideas:

We will plan for all 3 types of service (U tube, Zoom and Live)

We will have a Lent course led by Jane Fulford on Zoom – link to send to everyone.

Jane will get together with others and have a display in the garden.

In future we would consider Palm or Easter Sunday processions.

4. UPDATE ON ALL WORSHIP SERVICES

Memory worship group are bereft without their services. Thorpe Bay Methodist managed services in October and November, with social distancing which worked reasonably well. As soon as we can find a safe way back for Memory Worship it is desperately wanted.

Similarly, Fusion group are really missing their connection to Wesley. We must find a pathway to bring them back and support them.

MISSION AND OUTREACH

We last met a year ago and we followed up the Action Points

- We had badges made for everyone in a helper role at Wesley
- We held a Mission quiet prayer lunch
- We held a Songs of Praise service
- We organised a team to offer Saturday coffee at the front of the church

We agreed that in the aftermath of Covid we must plan to operate differently and not just return to the old normal and we should approach this as an opportunity. To assist in this, we will participate in some Mission training from District. The areas that will be looked at are as follows

- Decide on a process
- Do a community audit
- Conduct a church review
- Dream together
- Choose priorities
- Identify Actions
- Consider the fruit
- Review

In the meantime, we agreed that as soon as the government and Methodist church guidance allow, we will do everything in our power to resume Memory Worship, Fusion and start a coffee session in the church. We noted the need for support for the lonely and bereaved and will look into ways of answering this need.

We will look at this in detail at our next meeting on Monday 8th March 7.30pm
