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MINISTER'S LETTER



When we look at what seemed important to Jesus in the Bible; seeking out the 'undesirables' of society; the sick, the leper, the sinner, it was all very much 'people' issues. Bearing this in mind then, it might come as bit of a surprise how concerned Jesus was with what people contributed financially to the kingdom of God. Many have thought Jesus to be too spiritual to be concerned about such material things, but on at least one occasion whilst in the temple, Jesus sat near the treasury and watched intently as people made their contributions.

Luke 21:1-4; 'While Jesus was in the Temple, he watched the rich people dropping their gifts in the collection box.

Then a poor widow came by and dropped in two small coins. "I tell you the truth," Jesus said, "this poor widow has given more than all the rest of them. For they have given a tiny part of their surplus, but she, poor as she is, has given everything she has." [NLT]

He was *intensely* interested in what was taking place on that occasion. And Hebrews 13:8 tells us that; 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.' [NLT] So He was interested in the offerings of both the rich and the poor back then, and He continues to be interested in our gifts today, because as that reading said, He doesn't change.

It has been said that money talks and nowhere does it speak louder than when we are faced with an opportunity to make an investment in God's kingdom.

- ♣ Our gifts indicate our love for God.
- Our gifts indicate our interest in extending His kingdom.
- Our gifts indicate where our treasure is; whether God or money comes first in our lives.
- Our gifts are also an indication of our obedience to God.

The word *Tithe*, literally translated means 'tenth' 10% of our first fruits belong to God. Well actually, everything we own belongs to God! Psalm 24:1 says; 'The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it. So, God isn't asking us to give Him something we own, but a tenth of what we don't own! Because it already belongs to Him!

We can make this easy, that's 10% of your take home pay. So, if you take home £250.00 a week, God is asking for £25.00 per week.

If you take home £600.00 per week, God is asking for £60.00 per week. If only £10 per week, then it's only £1.00 and so on.

Now I *know* what you're first thought is going to be; I can't *afford* to do that! My response would be; "Can we afford not to!"

Malachi 3:10 tells us; 'Bring all the tithes into the storehouse so there will be enough food in my Temple. If you do," says the Lord of Heaven's Armies, "I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough room to take it in! Try it! Put me to the test!'

[NLT] I have seen this happen on numerous occasions where people have starting tithing, or increased their giving, and have said to me; "I haven't been out of pocket at all!" I have yet to see a faithful giver get into financial difficulty because of their tithing.

So why don't some of us tithe?

Well, we've talked about one of the first reasons; sometimes we just don't trust God enough to provide for us. And if that's the case, He never will... until we let Him! How can God provide for us when our aim is to provide for ourselves? Maybe some of us don't tithe because we love what we already have? Thinking that money and material things is what life is all about. But Jesus tells us that real living is not found in an abundance of things. Luke 12:15; 'Then he (Jesus) said, "Beware! Guard against every kind of greed. Life is not measured by how much you own." [NLT]

Or maybe it because as human's we have a natural tendency to procrastinate, and this may have caused many of us to delay tithing. *All* of us hesitate to do something which requires discipline and sacrifice.

Or maybe it's because we think the church doesn't need our money. Well, if that's your thought, think again. I'm astounded by the cost of running our physical building!

I know there have been swathes of time when we've been absent from our churches due to the pandemic, but the bills still keep coming, even though our income has diminished. So those who tithe, God says He will bless.

Malachi 3:10b; 'I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough room to take it in! Try it! Put me to the test!' [NLT] We can do literally that, because His promises are as sure today as they were then! //

If you are a *consistent* tither and God has blessed your heart in doing so, then when the opportunity arises, give your testimony to this fact and this will give strength to those who need encouragement in trusting God more fully in their financial lives.

If you have *not yet* discovered the joy of being a tither, I challenge you to become one. If you don't have faith to make the *full* decision in one big step, then *gradually* take *small* steps in the *right* direction, and begin by increasing your regular giving.

Again, God says; "I will open the windows of heaven for you.

I will pour out a blessing so great you won't have enough

room to take it in! [NLT] So, the question isn't can I afford to

tithe, but can I afford not to!

Worship Consultation
The different forms of worship, offered at Wesley, were discussed:

Sunday worship

- There are new people attending the Sunday morning services.
- Some existing attendees to Wesley are not planning to return to worship until we can meet unmasked and sing.

Action point: feather banner to say we are open and one to say 'not here' when it is a United service [Action: Annal

- Organ Ashley can play it now, but some notes are missing.
- Hymnbook box seems to be locked.

Memory worship – starting on 21 June. Some members have passed away since the congregation last met, so it is expected that the widowers and carers will attend this first service back in remembrance.

Informal worship – leave until September, unless it has already been advertised. **[Action: Sanya to check]**

Inspire – worship was held in May, five people attended. Next is 27 June. Have Mike and Sue on instruments. Later it was also discussed whether Inspire might be the place for more modern, contemporary, current and trending worship songs.

Private Prayer – on Saturday 5 June some café visitors asked to pray and Gaye helped them.

Time for Healing – not happening at the moment

Fusion – Leigh Town Council Youth Club is happening on 10 June. Leigh Town Council are planning to do 8-11- and 12–16-year-olds. Currently we are unaware that Fusion can meet. - Families toddler group in the café from September
- Music we did start a choir
 A lengthy discussion was had regarding music during worship at Wesley. The meeting talked about needing a mixture of styles in worship music during Sunday morning worship. Some ideas to help with this included:
 - A note to be placed in the letters to Local Preachers, Worship Leaders and visiting preachers
 - Come and learn a new song event at church similar to the song of praise event
 - Belfairs puppet group was given as example

- Well known hymn lyrics set to pop songs
- Sanya to see if this can be included in the Worship Academy programme 'where to start with modern songs?'
- Palm Sunday village walk in 2022 with Belfairs, Highlands and Wesley - for next meeting. This has not been discussed or agreed. Action: [Action: Sanya]
- Memorial for Covid this was discussed by the meeting. It was explained that for some people, this might be too painful, particularly if the passing of some loved ones will have been some time ago.
 Belfairs are holding a memorial service for Covid.
 The meeting agreed for Wesley to wait until any further potential third waves of the Covid infections pass before holding a service of memorial.

us some pointers and ideas.


Afternoon Tea and Cakes 2021.

Obituary Professor Kenneth MacKinnon 26th August 1933 – 21st May 2021

First and foremost, I would like to offer our sincere condolences to Ken's wife Rosalie, and their two children. Our older readers will remember Ken, even though it was in 1985 the family moved to live in the Black Isle, North of Inverness. He was quite a character, a very exuberant man flowing with abundance of energy.

Ken was born in the London Docklands area to parents whose families came from Popular. Sadly, his parents split when he was quite small, both Ken and his mother going to live with her mother and father.

During the London Blitz in 1941 he was evacuated along with many other children to Cornwall. Once hostilities started to ease on the home front in 1944, a number of children started to return. Mum and Ken were reunited, first in St Albans and later in the same year moved to Leigh-on-Sea, settling in a cottage near North Street Schools.

Ken started his secondary education at 'Westcliff High School for Boys', and even in those early days he became a Scottish Standard Bearer.

I believe on quite a number of occasions he would arrive at school wearing his Scottish Kilt, resulting in a visit to the principal for not conforming with School Uniform dress code. However, it did not stop him becoming 'Head Boy' of such a fine Grammar school. It was during this period he joined Wesley Youth Club, and then the Church. He remained loyal to Wesley for the rest of his life. His collection of Church Clarions make history, they go back to the very first edition in March 1962!

He took a double degree in sociology and economics at the London School of Economics, followed by National Service with a posting to Germany.

On his return, he taught in Essex schools and Technical Colleges and was head of department at the Barking Technical College and then senior lecturer and reader at the Hatfield Polytechnic.

Ken & Rosalie married in 1955 and they had two children Niall and Morag.

In 1957 aged 24 years he became a Credited Methodist Local Preacher. During his lifetime he wrote many hymns mainly in the Gaelic tongue, with Paul McDowell writing the accompanying music.

Turning to politics, in the 1958 Southend Borough elections he became a candidate to represent the Prittlewell Ward for the Liberal party which he won. Later he became an Alderman, Chairman of the Council's Planning Committee and in 1965-66 the first Liberal Mayor to represent Southend Borough Council. He was also the youngest Mayor, a record which I believe Ken, still holds to this day.

Leigh Annual Folk Carol Service, Ken started this in 1978, based on one he already produced, and organised for the Southend Folk Festival. I am pleased to say, this is still going from strength to strength! Fisherman's Chapel 1978-

2004, Wesley Methodist Church 2005-2007, St Clement's Church 2008-to date.

He continued to run the festival even after moving to Scotland. When due to ill health he was advised not to travel in 2010 he still continued to do much of the coordinating.

Ken was known as the father of Scottish Gaelic sociolinguistics studies.

Although not a native speaker of Gaelic, he taught himself Gaelic and took a master's degree. He was made a senior research fellow of the Social Science Research Council and a member of MAGOG between 2002 and 2004, a body providing advice on Gaelic to Scottish ministers.

He held an honorary professorship at the University of Aberdeen, was a reader emeritus at the University of Hertfordshire. He tutored for the Open University in social science, education and language studies which he did till his passing.
